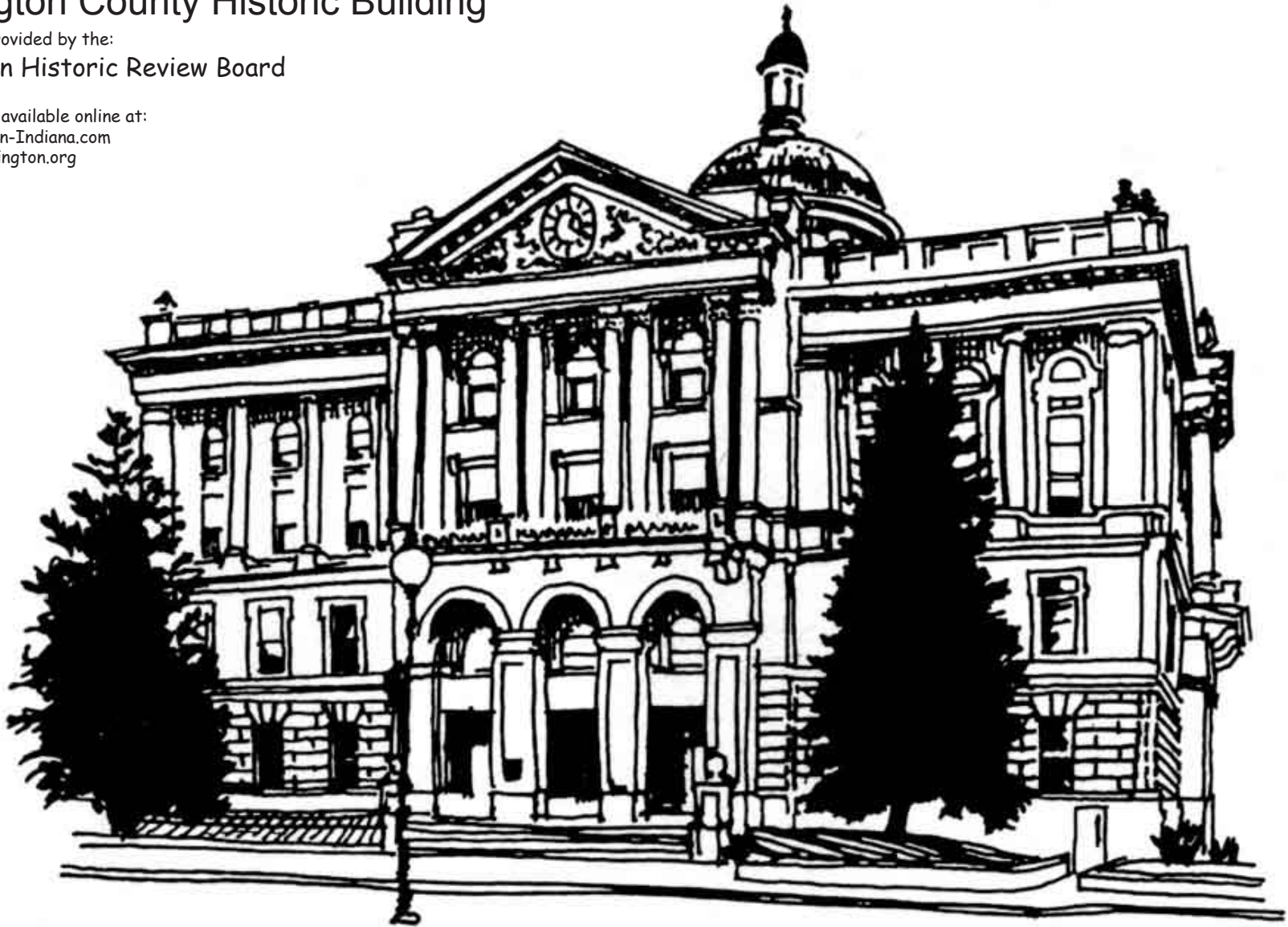

HUNTINGTON COUNTY COURTHOUSE -- The crowning jewel in the Courthouse Square National Register Historic District, this neo-classical building was erected in 1904. Its architect, J.W. Gaddis, proudly proclaimed the design, "Grecian architecture, using the Ionic and Corinthian styles, which are noted for their beauty of detail and elegance of proportion." Constructed of Bedford limestone, the edifice rises four stories to a flat roof upon which is an opulent ribbed dome, supported by neatly spaced columns and topped by a cupola and finial. All four elevations of the courthouse feature central porticos, with decorative entablature and classical pediments, within which are clocks, flanked by allegorical figures carved in low relief.
