**MOORE-CORLEW BLOCK** -- This building, individually listed on the National Register of Historic Places, was built in 1845 as a dry goods store for Samuel Moore by the local builder, John Kenower. Both men's families were among the first to settle in Huntington County and both played an important role in the development of Huntington. George R. Corlew owned the building in 1869 and constructed an addition which brought it to its present configuration. With its details, such as wooden lintels and sills and six-over-six windows, it is downtown's only early federal style structure.
